Mark Bernhardt's ZOOM PPT presentation on LEDs (Light Emitting Diodes), Tuesday, May 19 was exceptional. Marc reviewed the basic semi-conductor physics for LED's, and explained how combinations of very small (0.0040) chips-are used to produce of various temperatures, and hence colors of the light of light bulbs we now use. The color temperature of 2700 Kelvin, is considered 'WARM', and generally recommended. He also discussed the importance of the numbers of 'PIXELS' on our Cell-phone, computer, and TV screens.

Curt Koster is considering a ZOOM presentation for the June Meeting. His talk will be on Navigation, in general, and his personal experiences.
