
### How to find your Windows 10 Update level

To find out which Windows 10 operating system version you have and to see which build level is currently installed go to the settings.


Click on the cog wheel that appears in the lower left hand corner




### Click on the cog wheel




### Then Click on System

Information about Windows is found in the Windows Specifications section:




Windows is available in different editions like the profession and home versions. This PC has the home version. The version number is 1809 and this edition(build 17763.503) was installed on 2/22/2019.








Clicking on the windows 10 home version and then a support answer I got:

Feature updates for Windows 10 are released twice a year, targeting March and September, via the Semi-Annual Channel (SAC) and will be serviced with monthly quality updates for 18 months from the date of the release. We recommend that you begin deployment of each SAC release immediately to devices selected for early adoption and ramp up to full deployment at your discretion. This will enable you to gain access to new features, experiences, and integrated security as soon as possible.

In this table the blue row shows 1809 as the ideal Microsoft level to be at. My PC is at the best level. At times new test levels will be in release for developers. So you may not always want to be at the highest level.

If your PC is at a lower level than recommended you can return to Windows Update and manually trigger the correct level.
