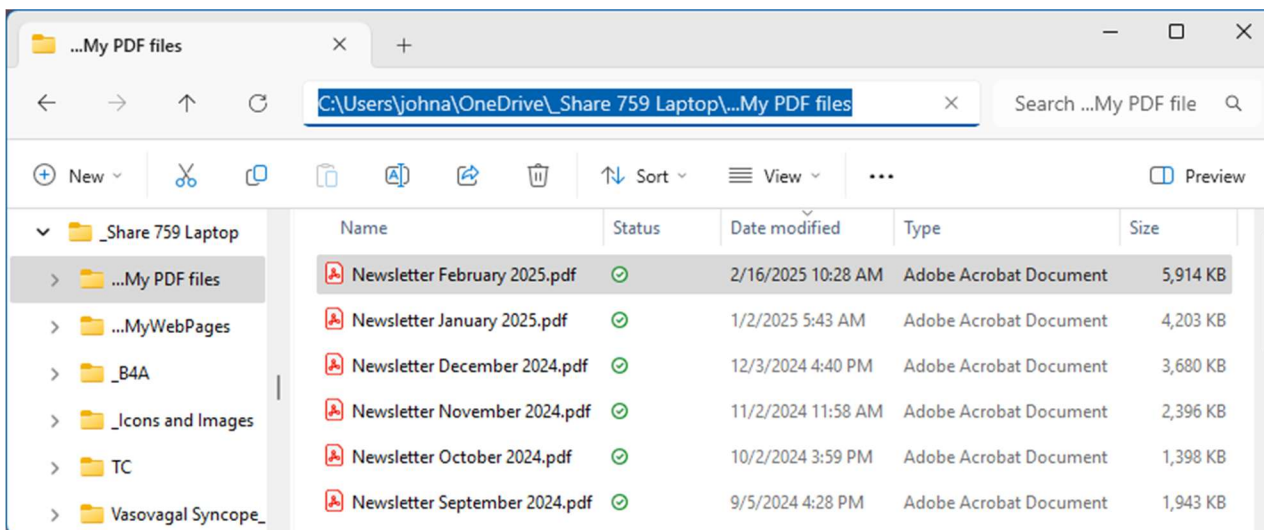
**Did you know?**

You can open files stored on your device using Edge. Even though Edge is an internet browser, it has other uses. Like opening files. On the internet the location of a page(file) is known as the URL( webpage address). Whereas, the location of a page(file) on your device is known as the PATH.

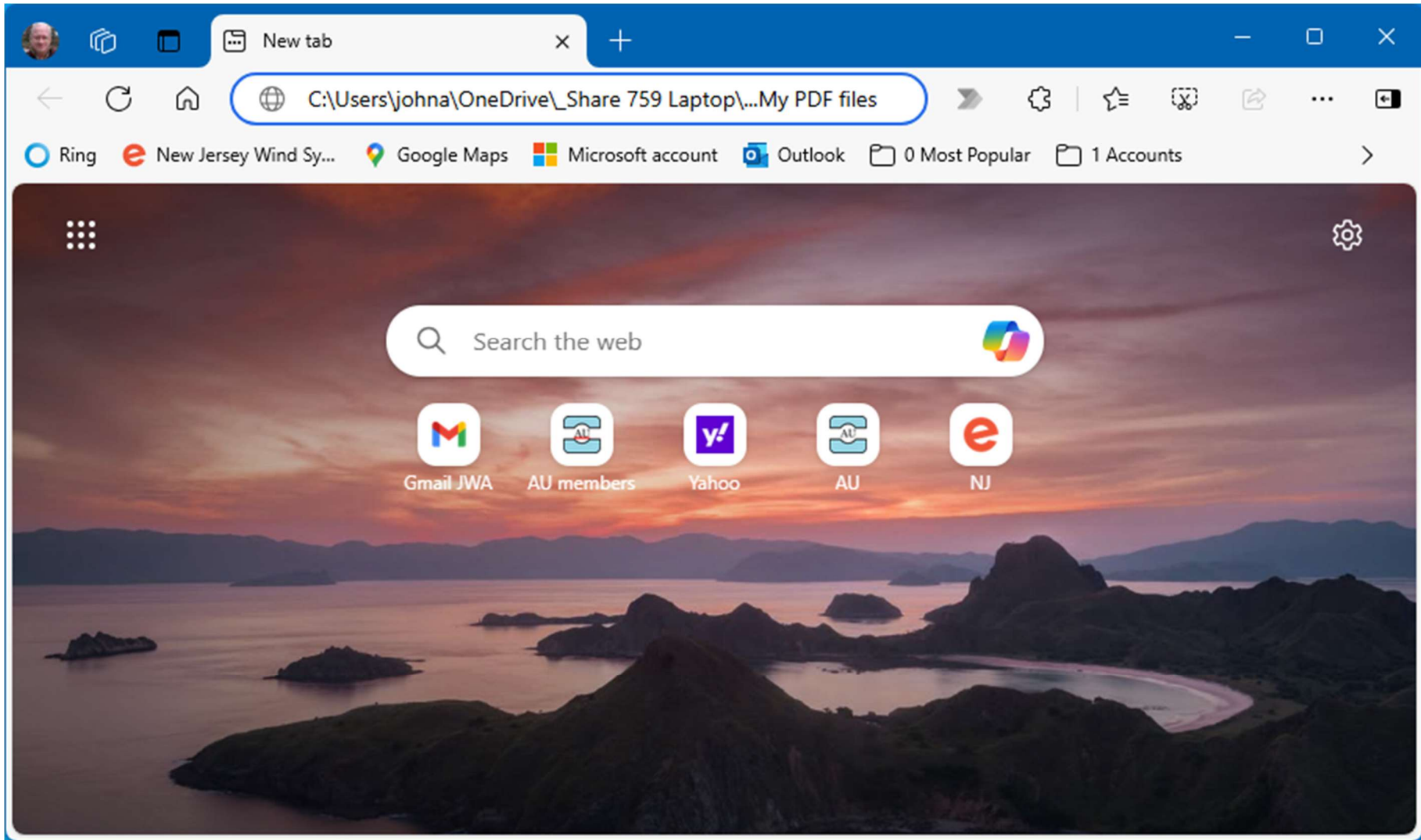
As an example, consider a PDF file that resides on your device. Using File Explorer we can find the file(PDF) and thereby identify the PATH(location)



If you highlight the path, then COPY it we can go to EDGE and show how to open it.



Launch EDGE and paste the PATH into the address box (URL box)



THEN

Add the name of the PDF. Put a backslash after the path followed by the name (Like: \Newsletter Apr 2024.PDF )

THE entered URL would be: **C:\Users\johna\OneDrive\Share 759 Laptop\...My PDF files\Newsletter Apr 2024.PDF**

Press the ENTER(RETURN) key to get:




