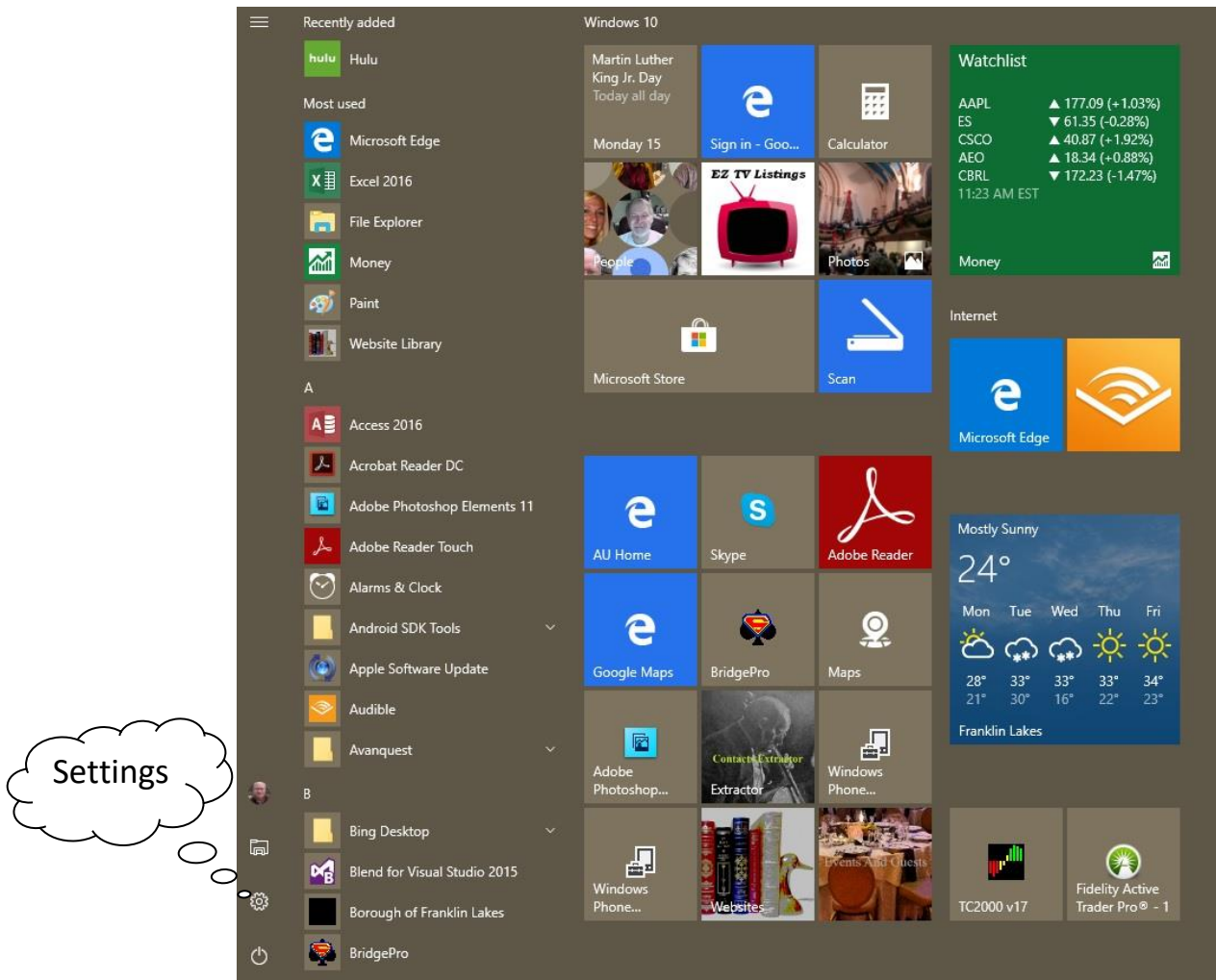


Stop pop ups

Windows 10 provides a lot of pop ups which they refer to as “notifications”.

You can stop them (or some of them) by turning them on or off in the Windows Setting APP. Click on the cog wheel tht appears in the lower left hand corner



Notifications are controlled under the System Icon “Display, notifications, power”
