Richard A. Botta MD

Dr. Richard A. Botta passed on March 17, 2023 at the age of 93. He was a devoted and loving husband, father, uncle and grandfather, and he died peacefully at his home in Wyckoff surrounded by his family.

Born June 12, 1929 in East Harlem, New York, he grew up in New York City and Queens, New York. He attended Flushing High School, the New York Military Academy and the University of Georgia was accepted at Marquette University School of Medicine, where he earned his medical degree. He did his medical residency at Flushing Hospital, where he met the love of his life, Patricia (nee Vaupel). They were married on April 7, 1956.

He began his medical career as a resident in Flushing Hospital, specializing in obstetrics and gynecology. When duty called, he joined the Navy and served as a physician at the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland. He was honorably discharged from the Navy as a Lieutenant Commander and started a private practice in Allendale, New Jersey in the basement of his home. Dr. Botta was an old-fashioned physician. If a patient had an emergency in the night or was ready to give birth, he would meet the patient at Valley Hospital or go on a house call. He was one of the original physicians on staff at the Valley Hospital in Ridgewood and delivered over 5,000 babies throughout his career.

While he loved his work and his patients, his true passion was his family. He was a dedicated and loving father to Trish and Chris, and later an adoring grandfather to Nicolas, Daniel and Tyler. He never missed one of Trish's riding competitions or Chris' hockey games, and later in retirement was his grandsons' biggest fans at their games and events. There is nothing he loved better than sitting around the dinner table, telling stories of his family and career as a physician.

n retirement, he traveled extensively and was involved as a Board Member of the Spring Meadow Condominium Association and Activities Unlimited in Wyckoff. He ran enjoyable trips. He served as Eucharistic Minister to the sick and homebound at St. Elizabeth's Church and delivered communion weekly to residents at the Christian Health Care Center.

He is survived by his wife of 67 years, Patricia; his daughter, Patricia, and her husband Joseph Dalimonte, of Aquebogue, New York; and son, Christopher, and his wife, Lisa, of Ramsey, New Jersey. He was loved by his three grandchildren, Nicolas Botta, Daniel Botta and Tyler Botta, numerous nieces and nephews. He was predeceased by his parents and his brother and best friend, Dr. J. Robert Botta.
