
There is plenty of room so if you want to have a stimulating morning, we invite you to join us, bring up a new topic, join in the talk, present opposing views or just listen, it's up to you.

### The Book Club

e welcomed Fred Theile as a new member, and Dick Botta as an old member renewing his credentials.

Tom Fitzpatrick performed a daunting task in explaining Scientology, as described in Inside Scientology by Janet Reisman. Scientology is a controversial "religion" started in the early 50's by L. Ron Hubbard, a science-fiction writer. It's hard to get one's arms around just what the Scientology belief system is. It started out as a self-help philosophy called Dianetics and evolved into, among other things, a belief in reincarnation, and, at some level, inter-galactic life form. One thing Scientology vehemently opposes is psychology and psychiatry, as anyone who watched Tom Cruise's appearance on the Oprah Show can attest to.

Lee Warner led us in a discussion of Calico Joe (John Grisham), a fictional baseball story that weaved real major league events and players into an interesting story about a despicable major league pitcher who purposely throws a beanball at a popular rookie player who has shown exceptional skills in all facets of the game, especially hitting. The story is told in the voice of the pitcher's son, which alternates from flashbacks to the time of the beanball, which destroys the rookie's promising career, to the present, when the son tries to undo some of the damage wrought by his father, leading to a surprise ending.

**Tony Quevedo** discussed some of the short stories in The Rendevous and Other Stories (Patrick O'Brian). Best known for his novels about the British Navy during the Napoleonic Wars, such as Master and Commander, O'Brian, in the 1950's, wrote this collection of very different stories, ranging from humorous to dramatic. Some members thought the endings to some of the stories were rather murky, although agreeing that the stories were well written.

**B** ob Saletta gave a very interesting talk at the November S/C meeting: 'Astronomy—History, Developments, and the Future'. In addition, Bob introduced us the use of the Internet to obtain written and video information on many topics associated with Science in general, along with many aspects of astronomy and cosmology. The ability to receive this information, as well as information itself, is truly outstanding.

On Tuesday, 12/18, Dr. Ronald Cauchard (an Optometrist whose Office is in Wyckoff) will update us on current testing approaches associated with Cataract and Glaucoma eye issues. Dr. Cauchard's talk will emphasize 'early detection' of these problems, which are of special importance for seniors.
