The group had a lively discussion around several very timely topics dealing with ISIS, migration, the Middle East, and US foreign policy. Our discussion ranged across all the topics and a variety of views were presented. There was a lot of discussion around whether the US should accept Syrian refugees and what the risks would be if the country did accept them. There was also a broad discussion of the role of Islam in promoting radicalization. Some felt the Koran was the root cause and that Islam was antithetical to western civilization while others pointed out that the radicalized population was a miniscule fraction of the global Muslim population. Nonetheless, most agreed that Muslim leaders needed to push back and emphasize a more contemporary reading of the Koran that would reflect shared global values. There was also discussion about how to respond to ISIS and the role of the US in that response. It was a very fascinating discussion with a lot of interesting facts and viewpoints presented. We all left a bit wiser than when we arrived (I think). You are encouraged to go to the AU website to read details about the meeting and the discussion. The next meeting will be on December 18th at Larkin House at 9:30 am. All members are welcome to attend.
