Public Discussion Group



The June meeting opened with a discussion of the proposed "28th Amendment" to the Constitution. Several members had received e-mails encouraging support of such an amendment, which would make any law Congress might pass, apply equally to the lawmakers as it would to ordinary citizens, e.g. provisions of the Affordable Care Act. Although there was general consensus that this made very good sense, it became clear that many of the claims made in the e-mails were misleading or factually inaccurate. Instances where Congress exempts members from complying with specific statutes were exceptional. Nonetheless, the question remained as to why there should be any exceptions!

Although a 2nd agreed subject- "Has a new Cold War with Russia begun?"- was on the agenda, events in Iraq preempted this topic and the rest of the time was devoted to discussing the morass in the Middle East. Participants expressed a variety of views about the reasons for the ISIS uprising in the Sunni area of Iraq as well as what the US should do. This led to a consideration of whether any vital US interest was really at stake. Most seemed to feel that a "hands off" approach was best, while recognizing that a safe haven in Iraq for terrorists could pose a threat to America. The complexity of the issues involved: the Sunni-Shia divide, Kurdish autonomy, the sectarianism of the Al-Malilki government, secure access to oil resources, commercial interests of the military-industrial complex, overlapping and competing interests with Iran and the long term security of Israel all came up in the discussion. If there was a conclusion, it was probably that there was no good answer to how the US Government should proceed. Nonetheless, everyone gained a better insight into the recent events in Iraq. Certainly a topic to be continued...

The group agreed to start next month's discussion with 2 topics: "Was the prisoner exchange for Bergdahl reasonable?" and "The proposed mosque in Midland Park: a good idea?" All AU members are welcome to attend and voice an opinion or just listen.
