he Science Club will meet on Tuesday, March 20<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 . AM on the second floor of Heneveld Hall. George Becker will make an interesting presentation on the various aspects of Memory, including a discussion of a patient who lost his ability to make new memories following surgery in 1953. This patient 'was recognized as the most important patient in the history of brain science'. George recommends reading a 2008 NYT obituary on this patient (contact George or myself for the link).

At the February Meeting, Bob Zehm made an outstanding presentation on 'Jobs and Machines', which started with a discussion of the interaction between two societies which are at different stages of development. What happens in the 'long run', to these societies after an interaction period involved with 'outsourcing' of Jobs, lower prices for goods, immigration, and the need for 'safety nets' etc. Bob notes that we seem to be approaching the realization of a 'humanoid' robot which is 'experience based' rather than today's which are 'knowledge Watson/Jeopardy based' (the computer).

At the April meeting Walt Widmer will present and discuss sections of an excellent DVD - 'Darwin's Dangerous Idea'. This DVD includes chapters on Evolution, Diseases (AIDS), and indicates that his ideas may be more important now, than in his own time to help us predict the future of life on earth.

Plans for the May/June meetings are being formulated, and may include a Trip to the Edison Museum (and house tour), or the Liberty Science Museum. During the Meeting, a discussion to try to reduce the effort required for a talk and encourages new presenters, was made (two shorter talks at one meeting etc.) Additionally, a list of books on Science and Mathematics as source material for talks was given to attendees.
