OVER TIME (Frank DeFord) recommended by **Vince Tortorelli**, is the author's memoir. He talks about his career at Sports Illustrated and NPR, his role in the old Miller Lite commercials, and relates stories about people like Arthur Ashe, a close friend, Jimmy "The Greek" Snyder, Bill Bradley, and many others. DeFord also pays homage to some of the great sports writers of the past, especially Grantland Rice. His writing is easy to read, literate and intelligent.......THE LAST CAMPAIGN (Zachary Karabell) recommended by **Joe Clinton**, describes the 1948 presidential campaign where Harry Truman pulled a big upset over Tom Dewey, the Republican candidate. There were two other significant candidates: Henry Wallace, of the Progressive Party, and Strom Thurmond, the States Rights candidate. The title refers to the fact that this was the last campaign before TV began playing a major role in elections. The book gives in depth profiles of the candidates, the challenges they faced, and their campaign strategies. Very well written, excellent analysis........ONE NATION (Ben Carson) introduced by **Walter Widmer**, gives the author's political manifesto, heavily influenced by his strong religious background. His main beefs are with political correctness, Obamacare, and what he sees as the heavy influence of Chicago-based political activist and community organizer Saul Alinsky ("Rules for Radicals") on the Far Left movement. Most members thought some of his ideas were common sense, and other ideas simplistic. If you want to get the measure of the man, this is book would be a good choice.

There were 20 AU Members in attendance at the Wednesday, April 15, 2015 meeting of the Computer Technology Club which included one new member ... the attendance was lower than normal as there was a conflict with the AU Book Club. The general topics for the meeting were a review of Gmail and Outlook including answering several questions from the March 2015 Meeting plus a look at Power Point.

The meeting kicked off with our new technology section ... this month we reviewed the Microsoft Band Microsoft's answer to the Apple Watch and several of the Fit type of devices out in the market place.
