Notice of purposed changes to our By Laws

1. Changes in dues for members attending the age of 90.

Our practice in recent years has been to allow members who joined before 2016 to be "dues free" in the year in which they are 90 YOA. Members who joined after December 31, 2015, did not have that privilege, they continued to pay dues. The proposed change in Bylaws will allow members who joined after 2015 and subsequently attain the age of 90 or more, to no longer pay dues after five consecutive years of membership in good standing.

The current By-Law is:

Article VIII: Dues

Section 5.

All members are required to pay dues with the following exception. Exception: Members in good standing as of December 31, 2015 do not pay dues beginning the year, they turn 90 years of age.

The proposed change is as follows:

Article VIII: Dues

Section 5.

All members are required to pay dues with the following exceptions:

- Members in good standing for five consecutive years do not pay dues beginning the year they turn 90 years of age.
- Members who have reached the age of 90 do not pay dues following the completion of five years of consecutive membership in good standing.

2. Changes to amendments.

The Current Bi-Law is:

ARTICLE XI: AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws may be amended by the membership at any regular meeting or duly called special meeting, provided that notice of the proposed amendment(s) shall have been given at a previous meeting and published in the previous two monthly newsletters in sufficient detail. A quorum (Article VII, Section 2) must be present. A two-thirds affirmative vote of members present is necessary "to amend".

The proposed change is as follows:

ARTICLE XI: AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws may be amended by the membership at any regular meeting or duly called special meeting, provided that notice of the proposed amendment(s) shall have been given at a previous meeting and published in the previous two monthly newsletters in sufficient detail. A two-thirds affirmative vote of members present is necessary "to amend"

Voting will be held at the General Meeting on December 13, 2022.

The Nominating committee's recommendation for the 2023 Executive Board:

Extract from AU By-laws:

Officers shall serve one term in the office to which they have been elected. However, at the option of the then member in office and the Nominating Committee, the Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer and Secretary may be elected for a second consecutive term. Except as otherwise provided herein, a member may again be elected to the same office provided that at least one term has elapsed. This does not restrict members from being elected to a different office in the interim. Installation of newly elected officers shall be the final "Order of Business" at the Annual Meeting, which will take place at the November General Meeting. Note: It has often been the past practice that the 1st VP, the 2nd VP, and Asst. Treasurer, step up to the next position. Also, the past Presidents need to confirm their desire to continue to serve. However, it is up to the Nominating Committee to finally decide the slate to be put forward to the Membership at the October General Meeting. All Members are also free to put forward nominations should they desire at that Meeting. The nominations shall be closed at the November General meeting. The election of the new officers by voice vote shall proceed. However, if there is more than one nominee for a particular office, voting shall be done by ballot.

Below are the results and represent a proposal by the Nominating Committee made to the Executive Board of AU. This is the slate of proposed candidates who were presented as part of our October 2022 General Meeting (October 11th held in connection with the breakfast event at the Brick House), and which shall be voted upon at the General Meeting in November (November 8th held at the Christian Reformed Church):
