The Science Club



t the S/C meeting on September 25th, **Peter Griffin** updated information from his presentation several years ago on Population Growth problems (from 7 billion on earth now to 9 billion by 2050), with implications on Environmental issues, Fuel, Food, Potable Water, Jobs, and Housing. Unfortunately, there do not appear to be any simple solutions, and while it was noted that Western Europe (including Russia) and North America have stabilized their birth rates, severe problems continue in Africa and other undeveloped nations.

On the first Saturday in October (10/6), the Science Club will visit the LaMont-Doherty Earth Observatory in Palisades, NY (close to Alpine, NJ), for its annual Open House. Several members of the S/C have attended the Open House previously, which includes opportunities to view exhibits and speak to professors etc., and they have indicated the trip is a 'must see/return'. The trip will be by private car, with the exhibits starting at 10 AM. Sign-up Sheets, including driver volunteers for the trip were distributed at the September 25th S/C meeting. During November, probably the first Thursday (11/1/12) a Trip is planned to the Liberty Science Museum. If interest is sufficient, a Bus Trip can be arranged. Information and sign-up Sheets for the trip were distributed at the September 25th meeting, with final info and Sign Up at the October Brick House Breakfast Meeting (10/9/12). Again, all AU members and friends are invited on this trip.

At the November S/C Meeting, Tuesday (11/20/12), **Bob Saletta** will give a very timely talk: Astronomy—History, Developments, and the Future. Subjects will include: Big Bang, Galaxies, Stars, Black Holes, Dark Matter, Microwave Background Radiation, Aliens, Space Exploration, and more.

At the December S/C meeting Tuesday, 12/18, Dr. Ronald Cauchard (an Optometrist whose Office is in Wyckoff) will update us on current testing approaches associated with Cataract and Glaucoma eye issues. Dr. Cauchard's talk will emphasize 'early detection' of these problems, which are of special importance for seniors. He will also discuss new type sophisticated computer controlled diagnostic tools.

ur member, **Don Kirkpatrick**, has been working with the Board of AU to create a new website for Activities Unlimited. Hopefully the AU member has submitted the information requested directly to the investment professional at least 10 days in ADVANCE of the meeting date. If the information is submitted in advance the meeting should be much more productive for the AU member! The IP's will answer questions, review the portfolio and offer ideas and comments based on the information that was submitted. This will be done without cost or obligation to our AU members.

(2) Investment Review Day

By appointment AU members (and their wives-optional) will meet in a separate room at WRC and spend 45 minutes with one investment professional (IP) who will provide ideas, comments and suggestions on the financial investment information provided by the AU member.

Obviously, the more the **IP** knows about you in advance and after a brief review the more ideas and comments he can offer. These scheduled 45 minute meetings will begin promptly at 9AM and continue at 10AM, 11AM, 12:30, 1:30, 2:30, 3:30, and 4:30 thus

potentially giving (8 hours times 9 IP's equals 72) 72 AU Guys the opportunity to get an independent portfolio review at no cost. Any and all financial information provided in advance will be mailed by the AU member directly to the individual professional that he is scheduled to see.
