

#### 2024 AU Stock Picking Contest

The Stock Picking Contest for the 2024 calendar year is open to ALL MEMBERS of AU.

There is no entry fee. Contest results are computed each month and at year-end. Results will be published in the Newsletter. Contestants MUST EMAIL their entry (one portfolio per member) to: au.club@optimum.net list no later than Jan 1, 2024.

Each contestant has a fictitious \$100,000 to invest. You must pick either 2, 4 or 5 securities. The investment will be divided equally over the submitted securities. Each month the contestant whose portfolio achieves the highest increase from the prior month to the current month shall be declared the monthly winner. A contestant can only be the monthly winner once. At year-end, all contestants are eligible for the honor of having the largest, second largest and third largest gain. For December monthly, first, second and third place results will be published in the January 2025 Newsletter.

In your entry use the ticker symbol (not the cusip) provided by Yahoo Finance. Any security OVER \$10 PER SHARE quoted by Yahoo is eligible, including stocks, ETF's, REITs, and funds (no bonds). If Yahoo discontinues quotes on a security for any reason during the year, the value of that security at the last month-end quoted is used for the remainder of the year. The contestant is responsible for notifying the contest Chairman, **John Abrahamsen**, of a split of a submitted stock. Positions in the portfolio **will not** include interest or dividends, contestants are encouraged to avoid investments that grow that way.

In your email entry include your name (if your email does not do that) and the list of ticker symbols that you are entering into the contest.

Old Farts have moral courage and personal integrity. They seldom brag unless it's about their children or grandchildren.


It's the Old Farts who know our great country is protected, not by politicians, but by the young men and women in the military serving their country.
