

Obituary of Joseph Thomas Infosino

Joseph Thomas Infosino, 92, of Oakland, New Jersey, passed away on September 14, 2024 in his home. He was a loving husband, father, grandfather, brother, uncle, and friend, and will be deeply missed.

His funeral mass was held at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church, Oakland, on Thursday, September 19, 2024 at 10:00am. Burial followed at Christ the King Cemetery in Franklin Lakes, NJ.

Joe was born in Brooklyn, New York to Rose and Joseph Infosino. He graduated from St. John's University *summa cum laude* in 1953 and received an MBA from Fairleigh Dickinson University in 1960. A lifelong learner, after retiring he attended courses at the Institute for Learning in Retirement at Bergen Community College.
